



Lions Screen Kids Sight

Format For 3 X 5 Index Card System

Before The Vision Screening Event

Before the vision screening event, the school staff should prepare for each student a 3x5 card containing the student's name, age in years, grade, teacher's name and if the student wears glasses written on it. The school staff should prepare two additional 3x5 cards for each class with the teachers name and grade written on them

At The Vision Screening Event

At the vision screening event, the school staff should give each student their 3x5 card, while in line, just before they are to be screened. Each student will present the 3 X 5 card to the Lion screener and will sit in a chair facing the Lion screener who is operating a Spot Vision Screener.

The card will be marked at the bottom with a **G** if the student is wearing glasses for the screening. If a student should be wearing glasses, but is not, **Screened without glasses** will be marked on the bottom of the card. We do not track G's, it is just for the nurse to know that they had them on when they were screened. We will also write down anything else of interest about the screening for the nurse including any visible abnormal health condition of the eyes.

The vision screening is performed at this time by the Lion screener who will record the vision results on the 3 x 5 card and retain it. The screening for that student is complete and the student may depart.

The screening results will be marked on the left side of the card: **P** for Pass, **R** for Refer, and **IR** for Inconclusive-Refer if screeners are unable to obtain a valid result. All Inconclusive results are considered referrals. Lion screeners will hold the cards until the end of the screenings

In a separate color testing activity occurring on the same day for kindergarten students, the results of the color testing will be marked on the right side of the card: **P** for Pass or **N** for Nonconforming



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Lions will tally the results of all screenings by class and all results marked on 3 x 5 cards will be returned to the school at the end of the screening event. No individual information or results will be retained by the Lions screening team.

3 X 5 Cards will be sorted into 2 groups, with Pass in one group and R, IR and N in the other group for each class. One 3x5 card with the teacher's name and grade will be placed on top of each group and marked either P for the Pass group or R,IR and N for the Refer or Nonconforming group

For those students who are marked P for Pass, no further action is required. For those students who are marked R or IR for Refer, school staff should send a referral letter to their parent or guardian stating the child needs to be further examined by an eye care professional.

The school staff should follow up in 6 to 8 weeks on such referrals for professional diagnosis

For those students who are marked N for color Nonconforming, the school staff should take action based on the school's standard procedures
